

madrigal dinner, and perform for other groups on the grounds. The Madrigal Retreat continues to be a rewarding experience that helps the students in group bonding and as musicians.






Dr. Bough works with YHS Bands



Saturday, November 7th, the seven students traveled to Glenbard East High School for a day of performing challenging music under the direction of professional and collegiate conductor/educators. The orchestra was under the direction of Mr. Kevin Noe, (opera, orchestra, and ballet director, Indiana
