"LUCKY STIFF": NEW MUSICAL TRADITION?

In 1983, Yorkville High School put on a production of **You're a Good Man Charlie Brown**, and it is remembered as the last musical YHS did in over 20 years. Since then, there has been a strong tradition of plays, but as I talked with the students, I found that there was also a lot of interest in doing another musical. I wondered if there wasn't a way to squeeze a third show into Yorkville's already busy calendar, and the answer came with my Madrigal class. In the past, the Madrigals had always worked on the Madrigal Dinner during the entire first semester. The second semester's project, however, had varied from jazz choirs to variety shows, but never included a musical. I decided the time and talent was right, and with Mr. Bogner's and the other play directors' blessings, I announced a musical for March.

The next step was choosing the appropriate show to do. There were too many talented singers in the class to do a smaller show with only a couple leads, but with only twenty students total, there were too few to do a large-scale one. We were also constrained by finances. Being the first musical in so long, we had no previous budget with which to work. Fortunately, the Music Boosters came to our rescue and loaned us the money we needed to get started. I quickly decided to do **Lucky Stiff**, in which a few of my friends had

starred in at a community theater near our college. It's a quirky show about a shoe salesman who has to take his uncle's dead body to the French Riviera on the vacation he never got to go on in life in order to inherit \$6 million. It had six larger roles to feature many of our performers, and a plethora of small, yet memorable roles, on which others could try their "acting chops"; there was something for everyone. It was a very well-written show, put together by the same team that did **Ragtime** and **Once On This Island**, and could be done on next to no budget. In short, it was perfect!

After seven intense weeks of rehearsing, the students put on a show in which I was very proud to have been involved. Scott McCartney, Lindsey Burt and Mike Bassett lived up to their reputations as seasoned performers, in three of the show's larger roles. Kassie Doty, a very focused and somewhat quiet student first semester, came out of left field with her spot-on performance of the reckless and scorned Rita LaPorta, showing amazing comedic timing. Hayley Hawkinson shined as she belted "Speaking French", Robert Cool mastered his ridiculous death scene with hilarity, and Mike Good played one of the most memorable nuns I think I'll ever see. No matter how small the role, everyone had me in stitches the entire show, from Kate Swithin's old lady and drunken maid, to Tami Stone's human roulette wheel. However, no one made more of what they were given than Jake Metz, who as the dead uncle, had not a single line, yet had every eye on him each time he was on stage.

The students and I had a fantastic time, and I think they put on a show that our audiences will not soon forget. With the proper planning and funds, perhaps this will be the start of a new tradition at YHS, one that we can open up to the entire student body. Hopefully, in the year 2024, **Lucky Stiff** will be remembered, not as the last musical we did, but as the first.

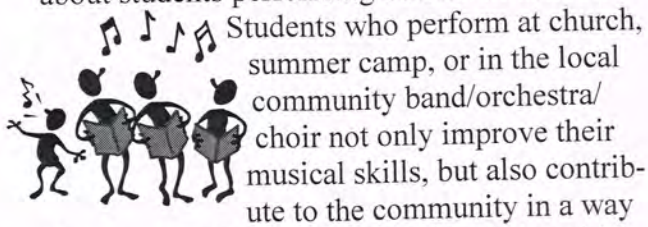
Anthony J. Gomez, saxophone
