The directors are very appreciative of the atmosphere of support fostered by music parents and administrators in this district. We want you to know how sincere we are: we have only to look at other districts (some quite nearby) to compare the support for positive musical experiences here as opposed to the intense pressure at some other schools where the feeling is, "Don't come home unless you get that Division I rating." Our philosophy is that students learn best through positive teaching, and that contests are good experiences because of what we learn in preparation for them, not just the score we receive while there.

We would like to recognize the students for the number of hours of preparation they invested prior

to these contests.

Circle Center students participated in the Illinois Grade School Music Association's contest, held February 27 at Indian Trails Junior High School in Plainfield. The IGSMA awards medals for Division I (excellent) and Division II (good) performances in both solo and ensemble (small group) categories. No medals are awarded for Division III or IV

performances.



Soloists earning a Division II rating were: Carlyn Bartles (soprano), Jamie Elkerton (soprano), Laura



Jim Tunnell: Showcased only one time on the stage, Jim had his audience loving his little boy character in Voices, part of the Twilight Trilogy.


Aaron White: Played with realism, sensitivity, and maturity, Aaron's Dr. Gibbs would make any town, not just Our Town, feel healthier and happier.


