


PRIVATE LESSONS ARE FOR EVERYONE!

On Saturday morning, November 3rd, thirteen Yorkville High School students and their directors traveled to Elgin High School to participate in the district IX music festival. For students, this was the culmination of months of practice and preparation which started when the audition music was released last January. It is a great honor for these students to be selected as there are around 3,000 students who audition for only a few hundred spots in the festival orchestra, band and choir. Auditions were held this year at Addison Trail High School on Tuesday afternoon October 2nd. From those auditions, eleven YHS students were selected to participate in the district honors festival. On the day of the festival, students rehearsed for many hours under the direction of professional and collegiate conductor/educators from around the state. The orchestra was under the direction of Dr. Daniel Sommerville, (Professor of Music, conductor of the Wheaton College Symphony Orchestra), the band was under the direction of Dr. Anthony Marinello, (Director of Bands-Illinois State University), and the choir was under the direction of Dr. Andrew Megill, (Director of Choral Activities - University of Illinois).





As a member of the JET (Japanese Exchange & Teaching) Program, he works at a middle school in Kami machi in the Miyagi prefecture. While his primary responsibilities are teaching conversational English to middle school students, Paul has also assists with the school's band program. When he is not helping students prepare for English speaking tests or speech contests, he is often in the music room using his low-level Japanese to assist with or lead rehearsals.





Now in his fourth year in Japan, Paul regularly performs and conducts for his school's performances and festivals. He is one of the conductors for the annual district band festival in which all middle schools in the district form a combined band. 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
