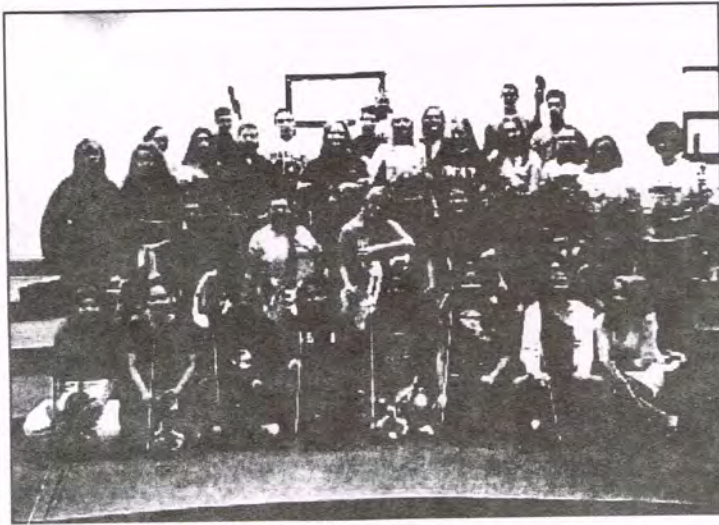

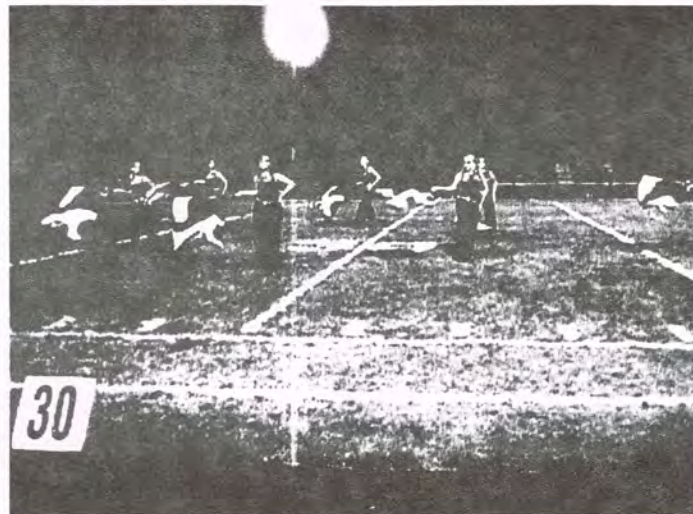

YHS CHORAL DEPARTMENT

2002 - Festivals - 2003

The Fall of 2002 proves to be a busy season for the YHS Chamber Singers. On October 23, the 53 singers will be heading for Northern Illinois University to perform in the NIU High School Choir Day Festival. Ten Northern Illinois area high schools will be performing for each other. A 25 minute warm-up time is provided for each choir prior to the performance. Immediately following the performance, guest clinician David L. Brunner, Director of Choral Activities, University of Central Florida, will work with the choir for 10-15 minutes. Each choir will have a follow-up clinic with NIU School of Music faculty members Eric Johnson or Glenda Cosenza. All high school choirs will then have an opportunity to hear a performance by the Northern Illinois University Choir.

Varsity Singers hope to attend the Women's Chorus Day for treble choirs at NIU on February 12, 2003. Women's Chorus Day brings treble choirs together to address the unique characteristics and expressive potential of the high school women's chorus. NIU faculty Eric Johnson or Glenda Cosenza will be conducting the 20-minute clinic session following each school's performance.

On Thursday, November 14, 2002, Chamber Singers will be going to Oswego High School to attend the Suburban Prairie Conference Choir Day. The festival will be held during the school day. All choirs (approximately 16 totaled) will attend either a morning or an afternoon session. Each performing group is to prepare two selections for evaluation and then have a mini-clinic with the clinician during the remaining time after their performance. The audience will consist of the schools in attendance at that particular a.m. or p.m. session. Students will gain insight from each school's performance and from the clinician's comments. At the conclusion of each session, a massed choir consisting of all the participants will perform a musical selection, already prepared by each director, to be rehearsed and conducted by the guest clinician.

YHS Choral Department

The YHS Vocal Department is well represented with approximately 160 students: 53 membership in Chamber Singers, Varsity Singers with 23 members, Concert Choir has a total of 58 members, and 24 Madrigal Singers.

Although each group is involved in different activities throughout the course of the school year, officers from each performing group get together to keep unity within the choral department.

IMEA DISTRICT IX SENIOR MUSIC FESTIVAL AUDITIONS

Fourteen students from the YHS Orchestra, Band and Choir Departments auditioned for the IMEA (Illinois Music Educator's Association) District IX Music Festival held at Addison Trail High School, Addison, Illinois on Tuesday, October 8, 2002.

The students competed against other area high schools' music students to earn the right to perform in the 2002 IMEA District IX Senior Music Festival Concert to be held on Saturday, November 16, 2002, at Aurora West High School in Aurora, Illinois. Competition and the actual audition was very stressful.

Those who auditioned were judged on musical talent in many areas: note/rhythm accuracy; quality of tone; scales and musicianship to name a few. Students were ranked on a point scale as they competed among all auditioning with the same instrument, vocally or instrumentally.

Students who excelled in the initial audition at Addison Trail High School are eligible to be selected for the All-State Music Festival held in Peoria, Illinois January 30 – February 1, 2003. The students will not know the results of the IMEA District IX Festival auditions until late October or early November.

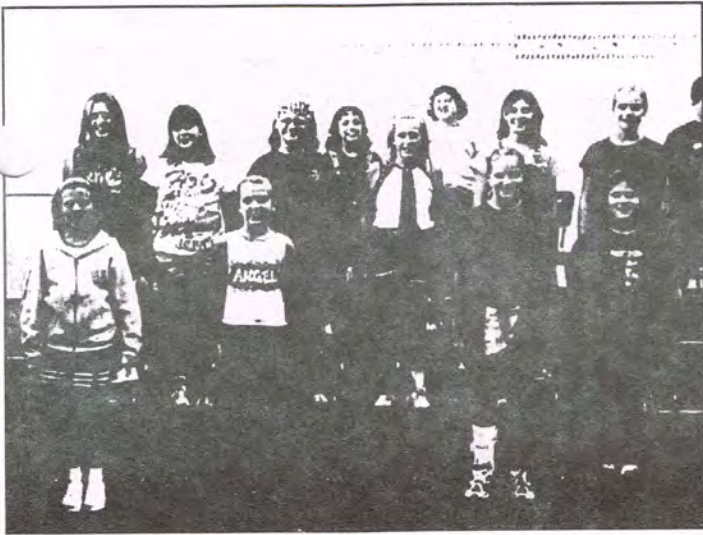

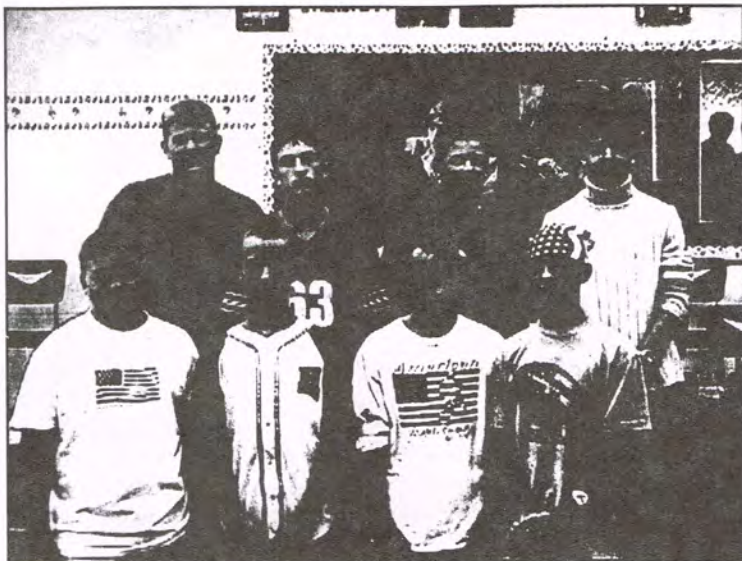
