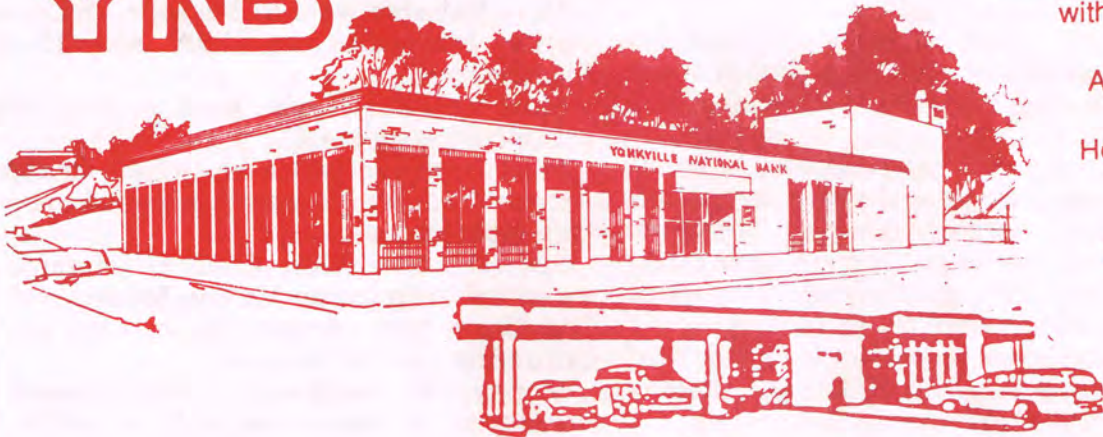

# Speech team impressive in tough competitions

The YHS speech team did an outstanding job this year, especially considering only six of the 19 members had ever competed for the team before.

Co-captains Michelle McCormick and Nathan Leaf led the team, finishing sixth at sectionals with their Humorous Duet Acting of William Shakespeare's "Taming of the Shrew."

Leaf also took a fifth at sectionals with his Dramatic Interpretation of "To Dance With A White Dog," which aired on television in December as a Hallmark special.

Making it to sectionals is especially hard in speech competition since there is no division for schools into Class A and AA based on size. Therefore, Yorkville thespians were competing against members of the top three schools in the state, which happen to be located in the Western Suburbs.

Also to be commended for making it into the final round at sectionals are Mary Cook and Rommy Muller who competed in Dramatic Duet Acting.

Others finishing in the top four of regionals which allowed them to compete at Sectionals were Eric Ginger in Original Comedy and Beckie Pinks in Original Oratory.

In a side note, freshman Valerie Moring's speech that she wrote for Original Oratory was awarded the

"Critic's Choice" honor at the Little Seven Literary Festival. This is the first time a Yorkville student has received this level of recognition in this competition.

End of the year awards were presented at the Speech Team banquet in March.

Most Valuable went to Michelle McCormick, a senior competing in HDA and Humorous Interpretation.

Most Valuable Novice went to Eric Ginger, a senior competing in OC.

Most Improved was a tie, which appropriately went to the duet of Rommy Muller and Mary Cook, both sophomores.

Special recognition Coaches' Awards were presented to freshman Valerie Moring and senior Dan Grote, both of whom the coaches felt put in extra effort to serve the team.

Moring, who competes in Oratory, stepped in to a vacancy at the last minute in Verse, while Grote, who has been competing in Comedy since he was a sophomore, also agreed to help out in a new event this year, Impromptu.

All in all, it was a great year with the team finishing among the top teams at all of their competitions.

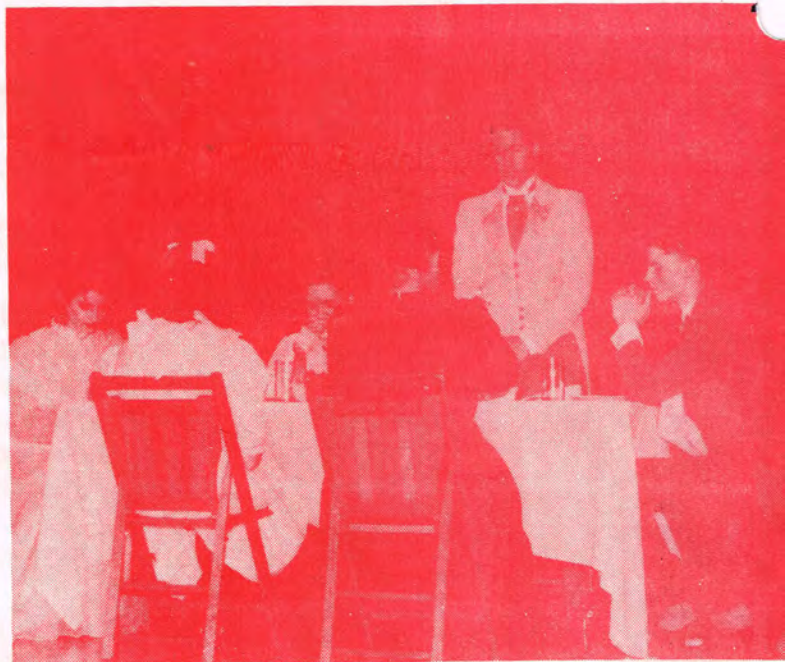
