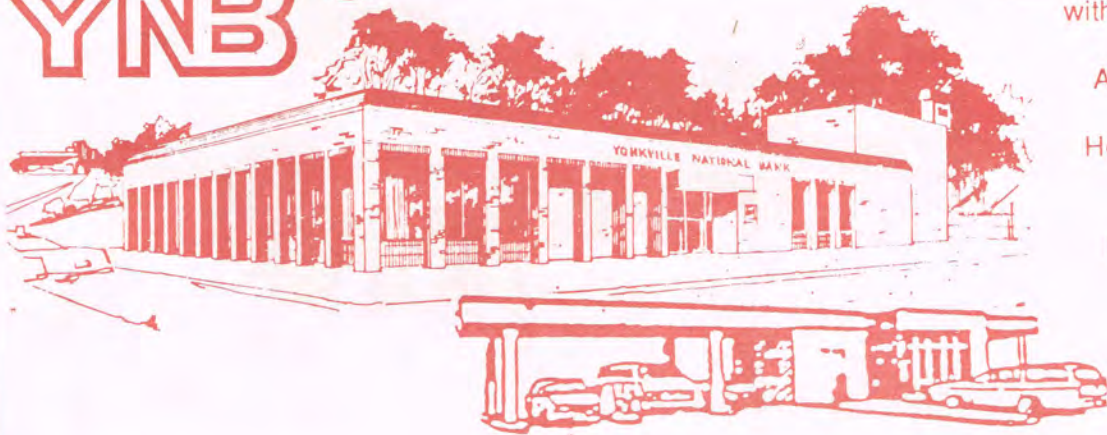

I make General Music classes fun, exciting and educational. My students are aware of the high expectations I hold for them personally and musically. The class climate is based on respect of self and others. The class works together as a team to receive 5 pluses per class period, thus a sticker. When a class earns 20 stickers, they have a party day and watch part of a musical.

Class objectives are formulated from the musical elements of rhythm, melody, harmony, form, timbre, texture, and dynamics which are taught through different learning styles (right and left brain, visual, auditory, kinesthetic) by singing, playing, reading, moving, listening, and creating.

Music is taught on a cart, "on wheels", moving room to room, or by using the cafeteria. The children are very helpful with moving carts, instruments, etc. The classes realize that their music time is valuable, and are always ready to participate

in the music activities. I look forward to the day when we will have the space in our schools for music rooms. Until then, we keep "rolling, rolling, rolling, keep the music flowing, - General Music Class."

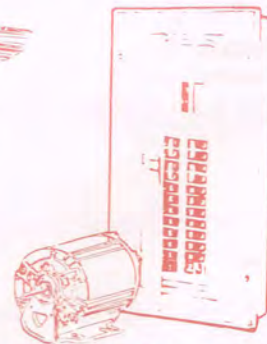

Orchestra

New style at CCMS creates team players in orchestra

The CCMS Orchestras are off to a great start this year! Both the Philharmonic and Symphonic Orchestras have improved tremendously since the end of August. The reasons for such improvements include alterations in both the seating arrangement and the format of rehearsals. With these changes, students can better understand the importance of music.

The establishment of rotating seats has de-emphasized the significance of ability levels and has stressed the importance of working as a team to make music. No every musician in the front row is the best, and by all means, not every musician placed in the back row is the worst. Each member will have the opportunity to sit in every chair of their section. The seating arrangement is not the only change responsible for this year's improvements.

The rehearsal format has changed as well. During each rehearsal, the Philharmonic Orchestra works in a scale book to improve such techniques as coordination, bowings, intonation, articulation, shifting and vibrato. As they concentrate on a different key signature each week, they also reinforce the intellectual aspects of music. The Symphonic Orchestra rehearses in a similar manner. Selected techniques are stressed on a weekly basis. For instance, one particular week we spent several minutes every rehearsal working on bow lifts with scale books, lesson books and concert music. This format is similar to a group lesson combined with rehearsal techniques. Since much time is spent improving techniques, less time is spent perfecting

music for concerts, hence the two orchestras combine for a few selections at the concerts. This gives the Philharmonic members the opportunity to expand their repertoire, and it allows the Symphonic members to play technically challenging music without spending valuable class time constantly drilling the difficult music.

A bid for support

Yorkville audiences can excitedly anticipate excellent entertainment planned by the arts educators this 94-95 school year. The fall music concert series, district-wide, and the fall high school play promise to present developed and polished talent. The high standards of the students' performances reflect the quality of the learning-teaching process by both students and staff.
