It is with great pride that we congratulate the Yorkville High School Wind Ensemble on their performance at the SuperState Concert Band Festival held on May 5<sup>th</sup> at the University of Illinois, Urbana/Champaign. The Superstate Festival is the most prestigious festival and honor that a concert band can achieve for the State of Illinois. The acceptance to this festival is the pinnacle of achievement for band programs across the State. While the YHS community is already proud of our students and program, acceptance to this festival validates our student's hard work and brands the Yorkville Bands as a program of excellence throughout the state and beyond. The performance by the Wind Ensemble was epic! The students performed *Scenes from "The Louvre" movement II. Children's Gallery*, by Norman Dello Joio and *Angels In The Architecture*, by Frank Ticheli. While the *Children's Gallery* is a playful, light, child-like piece, *Angels In The Architecture* is angelic and demonic, light and dark, good and evil. ### **Guest Conductors Provide Clinic Opportunities for YHS Musicians**

This year, band students at Yorkville High School have had the opportunity to work with some of the nation's leading conductors and music educators. These events are extremely valuable because in addition to pairing students with master teachers, they expose students to diverse viewpoints about music and artistic expression.

In January, Dr. Charles Menghini from Vandercook College of Music traveled to YHS to work with the Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Band. His visit fell on the first day back from winter break. It was quite the "welcome back" for our students but they impressed their teachers by being energetic and attentive throughout the clinic.

In March, the YHS Symphonic Band traveled to Pick-Staiger Concert Hall at Northwestern University for an hour-long clinic with Dr. Mallory Thompson, Director of Bands and professor of conducting at Northwestern University. The clinic consisted of playing a brief concert in Northwestern's beautiful Pick-Staiger Concert Hall followed by Dr. Thompson working with the students in a rehearsal for the remaining time. For almost all of the members of this year's symphonic band, it is their first year in an auditioned high

school ensemble. For this newly formed group, working with Dr. Thompson was a landmark experience that has raised the standard of the classroom.

Once again, our Wind Ensemble participated in the Plainfield Concert Band Invitational at Plainfield Central High School. For this event, students perform a brief concert for a panel of clinicians and then have a twenty minute clinic with one of the four clinicians. This year's panel Charles Menghini  $\mathbf{is}$ Dr. (Vandercook College of Music), Dr. James Lambrecht (Augustana College), Steve Eggleston (Illinois Wesleyan University), and Dr. Mike Fansler (Western Illinois University).

On April 30<sup>th</sup> Yorkville High School hosted Professor Craig Kirchhoff, Director of Bands at the University of Minnesota. During his time at YHS Professor Kirchhoff worked with the Symphonic Band and Wind Ensemble. The rehearsal with Wind Ensemble focused on their piece "Angles in the Architecture", a piece on the program for the ensemble's performance at Superstate, on May  $5^{\text{th}}$ .


